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FINAL REPORT ON SULPHUR EXPLORATION SULPHUR PROSPECTING PERMIT NO. 62 TWP. 109, RGE. 7 W5M

Sulphur Prospecting Permit No. 62 (7,680 acres) was acquired by Texaco Exploration on December 18, 1967 and renewed for six months on December 18, 1968. Exploration on the Permit was conducted during December 1968 and consisted of 42 twelve foot deep auger holes spaced at 1,000 foot intervals largely along existing seismic lines. The twelve foot depth was judged adequate for reconnaissance drilling based on industry's experience during the winter of 1967-1968 when any significant amount of sulphur found was always present at least as high as ten feet below the surface.

Two samples were taken from each hole and qualitative flame tests were run for presence of sulphur and semi-quantitative tests for water soluble sulphates. The latter test was included as a possible indirect clue to the presence of sulphur. No sulphur was detected in any of the 84 samples. Water soluble sulphate content varied indiscriminately and did not appear to be diagnostic.

In view of the completely negative results of the auger hole program it has been decided to surrender Permit No. 62

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
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
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
