FINAL REPORT ON SULPHUR EXPLORATION SULPHUR PROSPECTING PERMIT NO.193 TWP. 111, 112, RGE. 9, 10 W5M


Sulphur Prospecting Permit No. 193 (39,680 acres) was acquired by Texaco Exploration on August 29, 1968. The sulphur potential was subsequently evaluated by testing of samples from 601 seismic shot holes drilled on the Permit. The shot holes varied in depth from 40 to 60 feet, were spaced along the seismic lines at intervals of 330 feet, and were sampled at ten foot intervals for a total of approximately 3,000 samples. Sulphur was detected in samples from two holes only - shot holes 96 and 106 on Line 6. As indicated on the accompanying map sulphur content ranged up to a maximum of only 0.46% which is too slight to be of significance. In view of the almost total lack of sulphur found it has been decided to surrender Permit No. 193.
