Dear Mr Roy

In reply to your letter Re: permit # 141 in the name of Mr Buzan and myself.

Mr Worobe is presently sitting on a Wildcat well at Nordeg and Mr. Buzan is on holiday. I will give you all the information I can in the meantime.

Mr Worobe's report was based on the field trips I made to permit 141 and with the use of Paper 61-24 and map 35-1961 Geological Survey of Canada. (These papers are enclosed).

On the field trip I made to the property on the last two weeks of June, I gathered samples green stained rocks. Geologists for Alcoa informed me that these rocks were not copper bearing and not worth having assayed. These samples were taken from the Altyn and Sijeh formations. With this information Mr. Worobe concluded that the ground did not merit further examination.

Mr. Worobe was remunerated for his work in the form of a 50% interest in certificates of record #5 775 to 787 in the province of Alberta. We conservatively value this interest

at \$500⁰⁰, by reason of extensive work being conducted in the area. Copper has been found by Alcore in the Coppercunning formation in the general area, and our certificate of record consist partly of this formation.

The balance of the monies spent were on trying to get a major company to examine the property thoroughly. We were not successful however, for the same reasons as stated in Mr Worobee's report. We negotiated with Pacific Lpr in Edmonton, Alcore in Edmonton, United Bata, Hudsons Bay oil & Gas in Calgary.

If there is any more I can give you please let me know.
