### SUMMARY REPORT

Assessment work on Metallic and Industrial Minerals Permit No. 9301060063 for the initial two year period consisted of defining locations for extraction of suitable decorative rock of various sizes for landscaping, as well as for a source for riprap for erosion control projects. Road access into the area has been cut off for a number of years, necessitating use of "quads" and foot access on existing trails to explore the area for the products being sought.

This has been an unusual year in the South Region, given that forest fires and forest fire hazard have kept us out of potential work areas for some 120 days. Work we had planned to undertake was put off as a result, and our programs are therefore well behind schedule. In fact, two temporary bridges have been obtained to put in for access to extract bulk samples of the material for client approval. Bridge installation required for haulage equipment is expected to bring the bulk sample program expenditures to approximately \$10,000, which would have been spent and included in the work reported in this assessment report had fires and fire hazard not interfered with access to the property.

Total costs for initial assessment work during the two year period were \$3521, which exceeds the two year expenditure required for the 275.2 ha. retained by the amount of \$719. It is our understanding that this excess amount will be credited against the minimum spending requirements for any subsequent two-year period, consistent with Sec. 14 (2) and 14 (3) of Alberta Regulation 66/93, Mines and Minerals Act, METALLIC AND INDUSTRIAL MINERALS REGULATION.


